CONSUMER MANAGEMENT -

Dress Code - 4-H'ers will wear blue jeans, white shirt, or blouse that is long enough to be tucked in with a 4-H emblem. A 4-H tee shirt with sleeves, a 4-H emblem on the pocket or blouse front or a 4-H arm band will be acceptable. Hard soled shoes or boots must be worn for all the 4-H livestock shows. No hats or other headgear

except for western hats during the horse show.

This year this attire will be the policy for interview judging, livestock shows, livestock auction, and award ceremonies. Shooting Sports will wear their attire for their events and awards.

Failure to comply with this policy will result in loss of premium money and awards. Superintendents and fairboard members will enforce this policy.

DIVISION 227 - ATTENTION SHOPPERS

AGE - UNDER 12

CLASSES

Class 1 (C 227 900) - Clothing Wardrobe Inventory - List five items in your clothing wardrobe. What one garment would you add to your wardrobe that would help you to mix and match what you already have to extend your wardrobe? Explain what you need to think about and consider when you select this item. Consider creativity and style in your story. Your wardrobe inventory entry may be a picture poster, a video style show with explanation, a written story, an audio tape.

Class 2 (C 227 901) - Clothing Interview -

A. Interview an older person and talk about the fads and fashions of the time when they were young. Or
B. Interview a person from another culture and find out how their dress and fashions may differ at school, special occasions (such as weddings, graduations, birthdays, religious events), etc. How do those items differ or are they the same as what you wear? Or

C. Interview a person who wears special types of clothing for their job. Find out how these clothes differ from the ones they wear away from the job, what makes them different, why are they necessary to wear, etc.

Consider creativity and style in your story. Include a picture of the person you interviewed in their special type of clothing. Your interview entry may be a picture poster, a written story, audio tape, video tape with explanation.

Class 3 (C 227 902) - Buymanship - Experience buying a complete wearable outfit for less than \$75.

Your entry must include the hang tags (if available), information from fiber content and care labels and a story about what you considered when you purchased the outfit. Consider creativity and style in explaining your story. Do not include the clothing as part of your entry. Your buying entry may be a picture poster, a video tape, a written story or an audio tape.

Class 4 (C 227 903) - You Be The Teacher - Share with others what you learned in this project. Exhibit may be a poster (not to exceed 22" x 28"), a notebook or a small display of an educational nature.

Examples may include information on: Sort before you wash, clothing first aid, fad or fashion, etc.

DIVISION 240 - SHOPPING IN STYLE

Ages 12 & Over

CLASSES

Class 1 (C 240 1) - Purchased garment (not to be submitted).

Class 2 (C 240 2) - Garment selected, but not purchased.

Class 3 (C 240 3) - You Be The Teacher

Class 900 (C 240 900) - Other

GENERAL INFORMATION

A. The entry must be in an 8 ½" by 11" by 1" 3 ring notebook with the following information. Record books will not be accepted.

Total exhibits may be entered in any combination.

If Class 1, a minimum of 3 color close-up snapshots are required, including a full front view, back view and side view. All snapshots need to show the person standing straight and tall. If Class 2, the notebook must describe the 4-H'ers personal characteristics and provide sketches or pictures of the front and back views of the garment/outfit. Style, color and design details must be described.

Notebook for both classes must include a story to describe:

1. Include a budget. What amount do you have to spend?
2. Include a wardrobe inventory. Tell how the garment/outfit fills a void in the inventory.
3. Why did you need the item or why was the garment selected/purchased? What accessories were selected?
4. Physical characteristics of the individual. Refer to Body Basics discussion in project manual pages 16-18.
5. Compare the construction quality of the garment(s) selected and two other garments that were rejected.
6. What design features (color, pattern, fabric, etc.) affected your decision to select this garment(s)?
7. What is the fiber content, fabric structure and care?
8. Final cost of the outfit and estimated cost per wearing (cost of garment divided by estimated times to be worn for the life of the garment.) Take into consideration the care of the garment. Include in your figures the cost of supplies (detergent, softener, etc.) for doing a load of laundry or the dry cleaning cost for your garment.

Class 3, YOU BE THE TEACHER, Share with others what you learned in this project. Exhibit may be a poster (not to exceed 14" x 22"), a notebook or a small display of educational nature. Examples may include information on: wardrobe planning, clothing advertising, marketing, clothing care, stain removal, consumer comparison of clothing items, cost per wearing of personal wardrobe items, clothing label comparison (fiber and care labels) and affect on buying decisions, etc.

Class 1 (C 247 1) - Comparison Shopping, Page 9 - Considering the differences between your needs and wants on Page 6-9 in manual do comparison shopping for school supplies; OR purchasing a video, going to the movies, or movie rental

Class 2 (C 247 2) -Financial Goals, Page 20-21 - Using your creativity share three of your SMART financial goals in this exhibit. (One of Each: Short term, Intermediate, and Long Term)

Class 3 (C 247 3) -Educational Exhibit, Page 26 & 27 - Show what you have learned or done in this project through a poster, notebook, or thought exhibit.

Class 1 (C 248 1) - Comparison Chart, Page 23 - Using the comparison chart on Page 23 of the manual do a comparison of financial institutions such as bank, saving and loan, credit unions or other financial institutions on the Web or in your community.

Class 2 (C 248 2) - Advertisement, Page 26-27 - Make an ad for a product with help of page 26 in your manual.

DEPARTMENT C - FASHION SHOW

DIVISION 410 - FASHION SHOW

(Held prior to the fair)

- A. Any item modeled in the Fashion Revue must have been judged as a clothing construction exhibit.
- B. To participate in Fashion Revue Narration Forms must be in the Extension Office by the deadline date **JULY 07 - NO LATER** and an entry tag presented to the Fashion Revue Judge.
- C. All 4-H'ers must take part in the Public Fashion Revue to receive their premium or any special prizes.
- D. A 4-H'er must be enrolled in the project to model.
- E. A 4-Her may enter up to four items to model. Only two entry per class.
- F. Only appropriate items for public viewing can be modeled.

STATE RULES:

- 1. Garments worn in the 4-H Fashion Show can NOT be entered as Clothing Exhibits. Garments should be age appropriate.
- 2. Entries **NOT ACCEPTED**. The following items can NOT be entered in the State Fair 4-H Fashion Show.
 - 1. Decorate Your Duds embellished **purchased** garments or embellished **purchased** garments with original design, for example, **purchased** garments that are then tie-dyed or **purchased** garments that are then embellished with rhinestones (In this constructed fashion show class, the fabric must be made, then a garment is constructed from the newly made fabric.):
 - 2. Textile clothing accessories;

3. Nightshirt/loungewear, for example, flannel lounging pants;
4. Make One-Buy One; and
5. Recycled garments

CLASSES:

DECORATE YOUR DUDS

Class 10 (C 410 10) - Garment constructed from an Original Designed Fabric. Fabric is made first, then a garment is constructed from the fabric. Examples include: painting on fabric, color discharge, shibori tie dyeing, weaving fabric strips, crazy piecing and paper piecing, and color blocking fabric pieces. Other embellishments may be added. Embellished garment with original design entries and textile clothing accessory entries are NOT accepted.

Class C 410 900) - Other Decorate Your Duds Items not state fair eligible.

CLOTHING LEVEL 2

4-H members who have enrolled in or who have completed Sewing For You or Tailoring projects are NOT eligible. A purchased top can be worn to complete a vest or jacket outfit with a skirt, pants or shorts. Nightshirts, flannel lounging pants or any other type of loungewear CANNOT be modeled at State Fair.

□ **Appropriate** nightwear/loungewear can be modeled at the **County Fashion Revue**.

Class 20 (C410 20) - Possible types of garments include Dress; Skirted Outfit (skirt with shirt, vest of jacket OR jumper and shirt), Pants Outfit (pants with shirt, vest or jacket or jogging outfit), OR Shorts Outfit (shorts with shirt, vest of jacket of jogging outfit).

SEWING FOR YOU

Appropriate nightwear/loungewear can be modeled at **county fashion revue**. Nightwear/loungewear CANNOT be model at State Farr.

Class 30 (C 410 30) - Dress; Skirted Outfit (skirt with shirt, vest, or jacket OR jumper and shirt); Formal (dress or tuxedo for prom., wedding or other formal occasion); Pants Outfit (pants or shorts with shirt, vest, or jacket); Specialty Wear (costume, wester wear-chaps, chinks, or riding attire); Sports wear (jogging outfit, swim wear, aerobic wear, or ski wear); OR Coat/Outerwear/Jacket (lined or unlined, non-tailored);

TAILORING - Additional pieces with blazer, jacket or coat may either be constructed or purchased.

Class 40 (C 410 40- Tailored Blazer, Suit Jacket or Coat

SEWING FOR FUN

Class 901 (C 410 901) - Dirndl skirt or shorts.

Class 902 (C 410 902) - Other Non-wearable item, i.e. pillow, laundry bag, pillow case, etc.

CLOTHING LEVEL 1 - The entry must be a single garment entry modeled with a purchased garment or garment made by another person to complete the outfit. The project garment must be clearly identified in the narration.

Class 903 (C 410 903) - Simple top, simple bottom or simple dress..

Class 904 (C 410 904) - Other wearable items.

MIDDLE OR ADVANCED KNITTING_- Coordination of garments worn with knitted garment will also be evaluated.

Class 905 (C 410 905) - Middle or Advanced Unit Knitted Garment

MIDDLE OR ADVANCED CROCHET - Coordination of garments worn with crocheted garment will also be evaluated.

Class 906 (C 410 906) - Middle or Advanced Unit Crocheted Garment;

GARMENT MADE FOR ANOTHER PERSON_ The entry should be a complete, wearable outfit reflecting moderate to advanced work by the 4- H'er. The 4-H member who made the outfit must accompany the model. This is a county exhibit only. Models may be any age.

Class 907 (C 410 907) - Garment Made For Another Person

RECYCLED GARMENT

Class 908 (C 410 908) - Recycled Garment

ATTENTION SHOPPERS

Outfits modeled must be accompanied with a notebook judged in Division 244. Fashion Revue Narration Forms must be submitted to the Extension Office by the pre-entry deadline.

Class 909 (C 410 909) - Attention Shoppers

JUNIOR MAKE ONE/BUY ONE

4-H'ers enrolled in Sewing For Fun or Clothing Level 1

Class 910 (C 410 910) - Junior Make One/Buy One

MAKE ONE/BUY ONE - 4-H members enrolled in Knitting, Crocheting, Clothing Level 2, Sewing For You or Tailoring may enter in this class. It is okay to combine knitted or crocheted garment with a garment that the 4-H'er has also sewn. Please indicate this on the entry form.)

COUNTY ONLY:

SENIOR MAKE ONE/BUY ONE

Class 911 (C 410 911) - Combine sewn, knitted or crocheted garment(s) with a purchased item to make a complete wearable outfit. Both items must be modeled

PREMIUMS:

Purple - \$1.50 Blue - \$1.00

Red - \$.75 White - \$.50

NOTE: A PORTABLE SEWING MACHINE AND CASE WILL BE AWARDED. THE RECIPIENT WILL BE SELECTED BY THE JUDGES BASED ON 70% CONSTRUCTION AND 30% MODELING. A 4-H MEMBER MAY ONLY WIN THE SEWING MACHINE ONCE.

SHOPPING IN STYLE

FASHION REVUE

DIVISION 425

Participants must be enrolled in the Shopping In Style 4-H Project to enter. Participants will be allowed to model in both the constructed fashion show and the Shopping In Style fashion show. Make One/Buy One outfits are not allowed in this show.

This curriculum is developed and designed for youth ages 12 and older. Attention Shopper is the curriculum designed for youth under age 12.

Participants must model a complete outfit - all parts of the outfit must be purchased.
