

DEPARTMENT A - HERITAGE

An exhibit of items, pictures, maps, charts, slides/tapes, drawings, illustrations, writings or displays that depict the heritage of the member's family or community or 4-H history. Please note: Exhibits entered at own risk. Will not be responsible for loss or damage to family heirloom items or any items in this division. Displays should not be larger than 22" x 28" wide. Use the current entry form. Display collections securely in an attractive container no larger than 22" x 28". All entries must have documentation included. Exhibits must include NAME - COUNTY & PAST EXPERIENCE (years in Explore Your Heritage, Family Folklore or Foodways projects) on back of exhibit.

DIVISION 101 - LEVEL I

Beginning (1-4 years in project)

CLASSES

Class 1 (A 101 1) - Heritage poster or flat exhibit. Entries may be pictures, posters, items that depict family heritage. Exhibits must be supported by a written explanation.

Class 2 (A 101 2) - Family Genealogy/History Notebook - Include pedigree charts/family group sheets, with documentation for two-three generations of one family line, expanding each year.

Class 3 (A 101 3) - Local History Scrapbook/Notebook. Scrapbook or notebook that depicts history of local community or Nebraska that helps youth appreciate their heritage.

Class 4 (A 101 4) - Framed family groupings (or individuals) of pictures showing family history. Pictures must be supported by a written explanation.

Class 5 (A 101 5) - Other exhibits depicting the heritage of the member's family or community. Exhibit must be supported by a written explanation. May include biographical album of themselves or another family member, family cookbooks, etc.

Class 6 (A 101 6) - 4-H History Scrapbook. Scrapbook relating 4-H history of local club or county. Must be work of individual 4-H'er - no club project.

Class 7 (A 101 7) - 4-H History Poster - Poster relating 4-H history of local club or county or individual.

Class 8 (A 101 8) - Story or illustration about a historical event.

Class 9 (A 101 9) - Book review about local, Nebraska or regional history.

Class 10 (A 101 10) - Other historical exhibits - attach an explanation of historical importance.

Class 11 (A 101 11) - Family Traditions Book - Exhibitor scrapbook depicting family traditions of the past.

Class 12 (A 101 12) - Family Traditions Exhibit -Story or illustration of a family tradition or event. Exhibit must be supported by a written explanation.

Class 13 (A 101 13) - 4-H Club/County Scrapbook - Scrapbook relating 4-H history of local club or county compiled by club historian.

Class 14 (A 101 14) - 4-H Member Scrapbook. Scrapbook relating to individual 4-H member's 4-H history.

Class 15 (A 101 15) - Special Events Scrapbook - A scrapbook relating to a 4-H special event, such as Congress or CWF or a personal family special event, such as a trip, family reunion, etc.

HERITAGE

DIVISION 102 - LEVEL II

Advanced (over 4 years in project)

CLASSES

Class 1 (A 102 1) - Heritage poster or flat exhibit. Entries may be pictures, posters, items, etc. that depict family heritage. Exhibits must be supported by a written explanation.

Class 2 (A 102 2) - Family Genealogy/History Notebook - Include pedigree charts/family group sheets with documentation beyond two/three generations of one family line, expanding each year.

Class 3 (A 102 3) - Local History Scrapbook/Notebook - Scrapbook or notebook that depicts history of local community or Nebraska that helps youth appreciate their heritage.

Class 4 (A 102 4) - Framed family groupings (or individuals) of pictures showing family history. Pictures must be supported by a written explanation.

Class 5 (A 102 5) - Other exhibits depicting the heritage of the member's family or community.

Exhibit must be supported by a written explanation. May include biographical album of themselves or another family member, family cookbooks, etc.

Class 6 (A 102 6) - 4-H History Scrapbook - A Scrapbook relating 4- H history of local club or county. Must be work of individual 4-H'er - no club project.

Class 7 (A 102 7) - 4-H History Poster - Poster relating 4-H history of local club or county or individual.

Class 8 (A 102 8) - Story or illustration about a historical event.

Class 9 (A 102 9) - Book review about local, Nebraska or regional history.

Class 10 (A 102 10) - Other historical exhibits - attach an explanation of historical importance.

Class 11 (A 102 11) - Exhibit depicting the importance of a community or Nebraska historic landmark.

Class 12 (A 102 12) - Community Report documenting something of a historical significance from past to present.

Class 13 (A 102 13) - Historic collection (displayed securely and attractively in a container no larger than 22" x 28").

Class 14 (A 102 14) - Video/DVD or slide/tape documentary of a family or a community event. Must be produced and edited by 4-H member.

Class 15 (A 102 15) - 4-H Club/County Scrapbook - Scrapbook relating 4-H history of local club or county compiled by club historian.

Class 16 (A 102 16) - 4-H Member Scrapbook - Scrapbook relating to individual 4-H members' 4-H history.

Class 17 (A 102 17) - Special Events Scrapbook - A scrapbook relating to a 4-H Special event such as Congress, CWF or a personal or family special event such as a trip, family reunion, etc.

COMMUNICATION & EXPRESSIVE ART

Dress Code - 4-H'ers will wear blue jeans, white shirt, or blouse that is long enough to be tucked in with a 4-H emblem. A 4-H tee shirt with sleeves, a 4-H emblem on the pocket or blouse front or a 4-H arm band will be acceptable. Hard soled shoes or boots must be worn for all the 4-H livestock shows. No hats or other headgear except for western hats during the horse show.

This year this attire will be the policy for interview judging, livestock shows, livestock auction, and award ceremonies. Shooting Sports will wear their attire for their events and awards.

Failure to comply with this policy will result in loss of premium money and awards.

Superintendents and fairboard members will enforce this policy.

Does Not Apply To Banners, Club Exhibit, Music, or Presentations Please dress appropriately for the event.

DEPARTMENT B - CLUB EXHIBIT

This is an exhibit that will be displayed outside on the fair grounds and not in the 4-H exhibit hall. Examples of this are decorated hay bales, decorated and planted flower baskets, decorated trash barrels, etc. Make sure these exhibits are weather proof. They also need a weather proof sign on the display indicating the club name and county. There will be a \$5.00 premium to each club participating. The club is responsible for bringing the exhibit to the fair grounds, setting it up and taking it down.

DEPARTMENT B - TALENT

- A. Each group must have two or more participants, all must be 4-H members. A 4-H member may sing or perform in only one group but may accompany another group.
- B. Dress- Each participant will wear a 4- H Chevron or other prominent 4-H identification. The performing group may not use identification of a specific club, county or organization other than 4-H.
- C. Time - Each group is allowed two minutes after the cue from the contest chair to arrange themselves on stage and begin performing. Props are not encouraged, but if used must be in place within the time limit. The performance of each group is limited to not more than six minutes.
- D. Selection - Any number of songs may be sung within the six minutes time limit. Groups may sing any selection of their choice.
- E. Accompaniment - Recorded background music may be used only in Class I Drill and Dance Routine. In Class 3 Song Group, only recorded instrumental background music may be used. Performing groups must bring their own tape or CD. Please only have the music you need on the tape. Other song groups may be accompanied by piano, guitar, or other instruments. Live accompaniment, if used, may be by a 4-H member, parent or leader. Not more than one adult may accompany a group. All performers in the Band or Combo must be 4-H members. You must provide your own music stands.
- F. Song groups, combos and bands may appear with or without a director. The director of a group must be a 4-H member.
