CLASSES

Class 900 (H 892 900) - Bicycle Demonstration Display - to be exhibited by an individual. Exhibit may include 1) parts or system of a bicycle, 2) worn or broken parts or 3) a step by step procedure of how some repair or service job is performed. A limited number of photographs are acceptable. Actual parts or cut-aways of parts are recommended. The exhibit is to be prepared on a 24" high x 32" wide board not to exceed 1/4" in thickness. Bicycle safety posters may be entered in Department B - Posters - Division 152.

ROCKS

DIVISION 830 – 4-H GEOLOGY

1. The exhibit box should be 18" x 24" x 3 1/2 ". Plexiglass covers are required. Boxes with glass cover WILL NOT be accepted. All specimens are to be arranged across the narrow (18") dimension of the exhibit box, making the exhibit 18" across and 24" deep exactly. If a box has a sliding plexiglass cover, it must be removable from the top. Screws, locks, or other devices that would prevent judges from removing the cover should not be used.

2. Each exhibitor is required to identify each display box by placing an identification label bearing name, county or district and number of specimens in the upper left-hand corner of the plexiglass cover (inside-use clear double-sided tape to adhere gummed labels), and by attaching a label with the same information on the lower right corner of the box (outside).

3. Geology specimens should be labeled with the number of specimen, date collected, specimen name or description, and locality (county) where collected.

4. Specimens should be mounted in the box by proper groups: rocks, minerals, fossils.

5. Geology specimens must be collected from locations in Nebraska. Out-of-state specimens will not count in the minimum number for the class, nor will they be considered in the judging.

CLASSES

(Class 900 (H 830 900) Geology – Display at least 15 rocks, minerals, and fossils collected during the current 4-H year. Limited to one exhibit box 18" x 24" x 3 1/2" with plexiglass cover.

DEPARTMENT H - ROPE

DIVISION 893 - ROPE

Requirements: Each rope exhibit must be mounted on a board that is 1/4" thick x 24" high x 32" wide. All items placed on demo- boards in classes 5, 6, and 7 must be made according to instructions found in the 4-H Rope Manual EC 7-01-79. **Mount the knots in the same position as shown in the 4-H Rope Manual.** Either manila or synthetic rope may be used. When halters are exhibited, the tie rope, plus a required second piece of rope must show any three of the following items: 1) end whipping, 2) eye splice, 3) crown splice, 4) rosebud knot, 5) Matthew Walker knot or 6) diamond knot.

CLASSES

Class 900 (H 893 900) - Rope Display - At least 10 and not more than 12 knots, hitches, and splices (include two splices) made of 3/8" rope. Include appropriate board title and item labels. The end of all ropes must be whipped. Judging consideration will be given to difficulty of items shown on the board. (Score Sheet F 7- 06-79)

Class 901 (H 893 901) - Single Loop or Double Loop Halter - sheep and goats use 3/8" rope. See above requirements for halter classes. (Score Sheet 4-HF 27).

Class 902 (H 893 902) - Single Loop or

Double Loop Halter - cattle and horses use 5/8" or 3/4" rope. See above requirements for halter exhibits. (Score Sheet 4-H F 28).

DEPARTMENT X - MISCELLANEOUS

DIVISION 900 - MISCELLANEOUS

Dress Code - 4-H'ers will wear blue jeans, white shirt, or blouse that is long enough to be tucked in with a 4-H emblem. CLASSES

Class 900 (X 900 900) - Article & Supporting Information Sheet - This class is open to 4-H projects that do not have specific articles which can be exhibited in other classes in the 4-H Division. Each article exhibited must be accompanied by a supporting information sheet (suggested size 8 1/2" x 11") describing what the 4-H'er learned in the project and how the exhibit relates to the project.

DIVISION 901 - PROJECT DISASTER

Dress Code - 4-H'ers will wear blue jeans, white shirt, or blouse that is long enough to be tucked in with a 4-H emblem. This exhibit is for any project that failed. The “project disaster” must be exhibited.
