SHOW TIME: 1130 A.M. - Thursday, August 11

Dress Code - 4-H'ers will wear blue jeans, white shirt, or blouse that is long enough to be tucked in with a 4-H emblem. A 4-H tee shirt with sleeves, a 4-H emblem on the pocket or blouse front or a 4-H arm band will be acceptable. Hard soled shoes or boots must be worn for all the 4-H livestock shows. No hats or other headgear except for western hats during the horse show.

This year this attire will be the policy for interview judging, livestock shows, livestock auction, and award ceremonies. Shooting Sports will wear their attire for their events and awards.

Failure to comply with this policy will result in loss of premium money and awards. Superintendents and fairboard members will enforce this policy.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

The Swine Show at the Holt County Fair will be a terminal show. No breeding swine will be exhibited. All swine must be individually identified. Only swine not showing signs of infections, contagious, and/or communicable diseases, will be allowed to show. Under no circumstances may swine under quarantine be exhibited. A health certificate will not be required for terminal shows. Swine to be exhibited shall originate directly from a herd not under quarantine for pseudorabies AND

1. A Stage IV or V county; or
2. A pseudorabies qualified herd; or
3. Be individually tested and classified negative for pseudorabies within 30 days prior to exhibition.

A terminal show is a show where all animals go to slaughter with no animals returning home. Those who ship their market hogs for carcass data will be responsible for their own data collection fee. Shipping costs will be prorated to the exhibitor.

A trophy will be given for the best carcass hog.

A 4-H member carrying swine projects may enter three market hogs. A market hog may be either a gilt or barrow. Suggested weight of market hogs is 220 to 270 pounds. There will be a dock above 270 lbs. And no hogs under 220 will be accepted.

All 4-H members competing for showmanship must show their own animals. Everyone will be eligible to compete. If one exhibitor has more than one hog in the same class, another member may show their hog but must be the owner's exhibitor number. Extra numbers can be obtained at the 4-H office.

For reasons dictated by carcass contests pigs must be shown without hairdressing compounds. This includes oil, powder, or any other coat dressing compounds. Water is permitted.
